### **Market Area**

Step 1. 26.45(c) Actual relative availability of DBEs

Determine the base figure for the relative availability of DBEs. The base figure for the relative availability was calculated as follows:

See attached Table 1.

We divided the total number of DBE's (column G) by the total number of All Firms (column F) to establish a base figure for each contract (column H). A weighted goal (column K) was then calculated for each project by multiplying the percentage of available DBE firms (column H) by the ratio of each area of work as a portion of the contract total (column E line item divided by the contract total in column E).

A total base figure of 7% of all firms ready, willing and able was calculated by dividing the total number of DBE firms (column G) for all projects by the total number of all firms (column G). A weighted base figure of 16% was calculated by multiplying the percentage of available DBE firms (column H) by the ratio of each area of work as a portion of the total dollars to be let (column E divided by the total of all contracts). (See column M for line-by-line percentages.)

The data source or demonstrable evidence used to derive the numerator was: Available DBE firms as listed in the Missouri Regional Certification Committee directory.

The data source or demonstrable evidence used to derive the denominator was: All firms as listed in census data.

Step 2. 26.45(d): Adjustments to Step 1 base figure.

After calculating a base figure of the relative availability of DBEs, evidence was examined to determine what adjustment (if any) was needed to the base figure in order to arrive at the overall goal.

An examination of the anticipated contracts for each fiscal year, the availability of the DBE firms by trade classification and the volume of work performed by DBE firms over previous years.

### Past History Participation

Other data used to determine the adjustment to the base figure was the median of historical DBE accomplishments, as follows:

Arranging this historical data from low to high (0%, 21%, 28%, 36%, 41%) the median is 28%.

The proposed Overall DBE Goals are as follows:

• Fiscal Year 2017 – 21 (14 + 28)/2)

- Fiscal Year 2018 21.5 (15 + 28)/2)
- Fiscal Year 2019 21 (14 + 28)/2)

Our proposed overall three year goal will be reflected as an average of the three years.

• Average of the three years (21 + 21.5 + 21)/3 = 21%

To arrive at an overall goal, we added our Step 1 base figure with our Step 2 adjustment figure and then averaged the total arriving at an overall goal of 21%. We feel this adjusted goal figure will accurately reflect DBE participation that can be achieved for the type of work being awarded during this three-year period.

### Breakout of Estimated "Race and Gender Neutral" (RN) and "Race and Gender Conscious" (RC) Participation.

26.51(b) (1-9)

The recipient will meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using RN means of facilitating DBE participation.

- 1. Arranging solicitations, times for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules in ways that facilitates DBE, and other small businesses, participation;
- 2. Carrying out information and communications programs on contracting procedures and specific contract opportunities;
- 3. In partnership with our UCP, providing services to help DBE's and other small businesses improve long-term development, increase opportunities to participate in a variety of kinds of work, handle increasingly significant projects, and achieve eventual self-sufficiency;
- 4. Ensuring distribution of DBE directory to the widest feasible universe of potential prime contractors.

The recipient estimates that in meeting its overall goal 21%, it will obtain 4% from RN participation and 17% through RC measures.

This breakout is based on:

In FFY-15, the Recipient's participation on completed contracts exceeded their goals by 4%, which is
evidence of race-neutral participation, therefore, 4% of our 21% goal is being applied to race-neutral
and the remaining 17% is applied to race-conscious participation.

Lambert-St. Louis International Airport will adjust the estimated breakout of RN and RC DBE participation as needed to reflect actual DBE participation (see Section 26.51(f)) and track and report RN and RC participation separately. For reporting purposes, RN DBE participation includes, but is not necessarily limited to, the following: DBE participation through a prime contract obtained through customary competitive procurement procedures; DBE participation through a subcontract on a prime contract that does not carry a DBE goal, DBE participation on a prime contract exceeding a contract goal and DBE participation through a subcontract from a prime contractor that did not consider a firm's DBE status in making the award.

#### PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

#### Consultation: Section 26.45(g)(1).

In establishing the overall goal, Lambert-St. Louis International Airport provided for consultation and publication. This included consultation with minority, women's and general contractor groups, community organizations, and other officials or organizations which could be expected to have information concerning the availability of disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for DBEs, and the Airport's efforts to establish a level playing field for the participation of DBEs. The consultation included a scheduled, direct, interactive exchange including a face-to-face meeting and simultaneous online teleconference with as many interested stakeholders as possible focused on obtaining information relevant to the Airport's goal setting process, and it occurred on Wednesday, July 27, 2016, before we were required to submit our goal methodology to the operating administration for review pursuant to paragraph (f) of this section.

The invitation was sent to nearly 500 individuals including representatives of local organizations representing minority, women's and general contractors as well as prime contractors and certified firms and internal stakeholders. It was attended by 25 individuals. The bulk of the meeting focused on reviewing and clarifying the goal-setting methodology with the only concern raised related to the fact that the Airport is unable, with currently available resources, to factor in firms' capacity in the calculation of available firms.

Following the consultation, we published a notice on our website of the proposed overall goal.

#### **Contract Goals**

Lambert-St. Louis International Airport will use contract goals to meet any portion of the overall goal that the recipient does not project being able to meet using race neutral means. Contract goals are established so that, over the period to which the overall goal applies, they will cumulatively result in meeting any portion of the recipient's overall goal that is not projected to be met through the use of race neutral means.

Lambert-St. Louis International Airport will establish contract goals only on those DOT-assisted contracts that have subcontracting possibilities. It need not establish a contract goal on every such contract, and the size of the contract goals will be adapted to the circumstances of each such contract (e.g., type and location of work and availability of DBE's to perform the particular type of work).

We will express our contract goals as a percentage of the total amount of a DOT-assisted contract.
